LITTLE WISHES granted wishes for **1,400** youth to participate in crucial social, emotional and academic development activities.

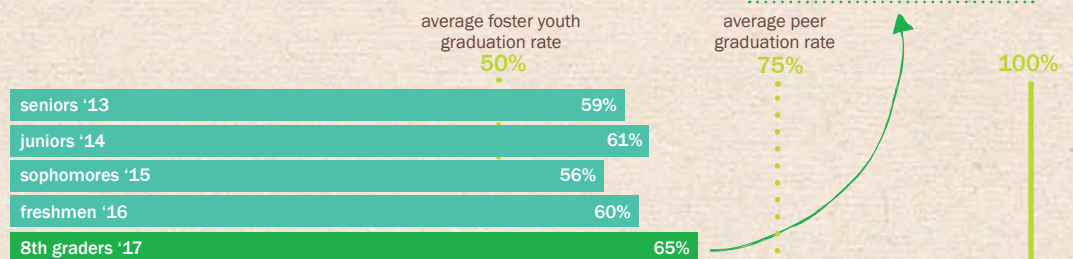


HOLIDAY MAGIC provided a significant holiday gift for more than **5,400** kids.

When I started middle school, I wasn't that good of a student. My Treehouse Education Specialist, Amy, encouraged me to stay after-school for extra help, even when I didn't want to. I was struggling in Language Arts and the assistance I received on my essays helped me to improve my grade. Amy also helped me prepare for the MSP test. This year, I passed not only the Math MSP but also the Reading one! These scores are a really good thing because I used to be a few grade levels behind and now I am one year ahead in Reading!

Now I keep a 3.3 GPA because of the support from Treehouse. My dream in high school is for four straight years to have a 4.0 GPA. With the help of my family and Amy pointing me in the right direction and leaving all negativity behind, I can see myself in the future being a CEO of a worldwide company.
